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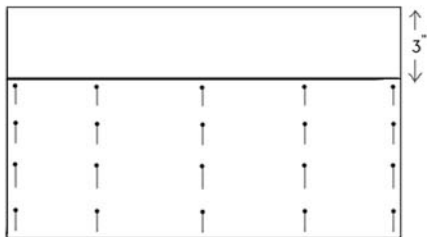
# Cutlery Tote

## Making the Pockets

- 1 Fold your tea towel almost in half but be sure to leave a 3" area at the top.



- 2 Separate the pocket widths by pinning them loosely in place. You can use any width you'd like for your pockets. We created four inch pockets for our sample.



## Creating the Tie Strap

- 3 Using iron, press strip in half wrong sides together.



- 4 Open the strip, and fold each of the raw edges in towards the pressed line, down towards the center of the fabric.

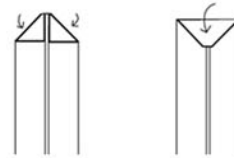

## Materials

22" x 22" square tea towel  
3" x 45" fabric strip for tie

- 5 Tuck in one half inch on each side hiding the raw edges.



- 6 Fold in half again enclosing the raw edges in the center of the fold and press.

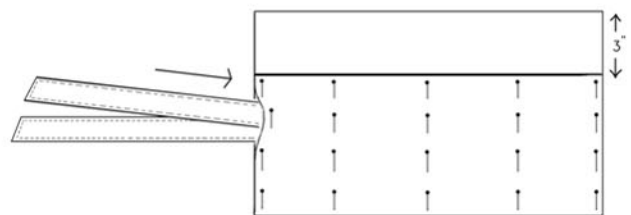


- 7 Stitch around all 4 sides of the tie.



## Finishing your Tote

- 8 Fold the completed strap in half and tuck into the side of your tea towel.



- 9 Sew the outer edges of your tea towel followed by the inside seams to create the pockets for your cutlery.
